Dear President White:

The Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges, Western Association of Schools and Colleges, at its meeting January 7-9, 2015, reviewed the Follow-Up Report submitted by Woodland Community College, the report of the evaluation team that visited Thursday, November 6, 2014, and considered the additional materials and presentation by College representatives. The Report was certified by district and college leadership, including the chair of the governing board, the Chancellor, the college president, and leaders of the faculty, staff, and student organizations.

**College Accreditation Reaffirmed:**

The Commission acted to **remove Warning** and **reaffirm accreditation**. Based on the evidence in the College Report and additional materials and the team report, the Commission finds that the College has provided evidence that it addressed College Recommendation 3 and District Recommendations 1, 2, 3, and 4, resolved the deficiencies and met Standards I.A.1, I.A.4, I.B, I.B.1, I.B. 2, I.B.5, II.A, II.A.1, II.A.1b, II.A.2, II.A.2d, II.B, II.C, III.A, III.A.1 a-b, III.A.6, III.B, III.B.2.b, III.C, III.C.2, III.D.1 a-d, III.D.2.b, III.D.3, III.D.4, IV.A, IV.B, IV.B.3.

Institutions are expected to meet Eligibility Requirements, Accreditation Standards, and Commission policies at all times during the six-year review cycle. Woodland Community College must demonstrate to the Commission at the time of the next regularly scheduled report that the recent changes implemented to resolve deficiencies and meet Eligibility Requirements and Standards have been sustained. Woodland Community College will submit a **Midterm Report** in **fall 2015**.<sup>1</sup>

The Follow-Up Report submitted in October 2014 will become part of the accreditation history of the College. The Commission requires that you give the Report and this letter appropriate dissemination to your College staff and to those who were signatories of your Follow-Up Report. This group should include the campus leadership, the Chancellor, and the Board of Trustees.
